



INTERMEDIATE CARE FACILITY FOR THE MENTALLY RETARDED

ICF-MR is a community integrated program offering a full array of services both in-house and through local community resources to people with developmental disabilities and other special needs that require support and assistance in daily life skills development. Individuals also receive medical monitoring. Training programs are tailored, and designed, to develop maximum independence in all areas including physical development, adaptive behavior, individual living, speech and language, health care, community, and leisure, cognitive, social, emotional and vocational skills by providing individual active treatment programming in a least restrictive setting.

ICF-MR's highly trained staff and home-like environments provide each individual with training in basic life and social skills to prepare them for living in a community situation. Services include medical/nursing, pharmacy, occupational, physical, speech, recreation and behavior therapies and social and vocational services. Family members and individuals are a part of the planning team and are encouraged to participate in all aspects of program development.

Living Assistants are the primary teachers/trainers and role models for individuals in the ICF/MR. Training is provided in all areas of basic life skills including, but not limited to, activities of daily living, leisure, socialization, community survival, and vocational skills.

Vocational Services are provided away from the agency at the CCI workshop in DeWitt. Living Assistants travel with the individuals and work with them to provide services. Individuals are taught in work-oriented activities as well as in self-help, socialization and community survival skills.

Recreational Services: The goal of recreational programming is to expose individuals to a wide variety of leisure options as determined by each individual's interests. The needed skills are then taught to the individuals in order to pursue those interests. Individuals will be involved in numerous community activities and will take advantage of community offerings.
